October 1, 2020

A regular meeting of the Ashland City Council was held at the Ashland Community Resource Center on the 1st day of October, 2020 at 7:00 p.m.

Notice of meeting was advertised in the Ashland Gazette on September 24, 2020. The Mayor and all Council Members received advance notice of the meeting and a copy of the agenda as shown by the Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Grauerholz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and a quorum was declared. Mayor Grauerholz noted the Open Meetings Act located on the south wall of the room.

City Administrator Quady said the survey presented is a draft that will be changed to match the dimensions of the drawing by the Building Official. She explained the Council will set the fee for the property and that the amount she put into the resolution was determined based on the square foot fee paid for land sold to the Ashland Campground. Mayor Grauerholz said Brian Whitehead's intent is to add onto BW's storage and cooler. Quady said Whitehead paid for the survey and will take care of the City's sprinkler system. Discussion was held.

Council Member Niemeyer questioned who would pay for the paving. Wischmann asked City Administrator Quady to get a bid for the one by the Carnegie Library. Quady said the alleys are public and by ordinance the abutting property owners are to maintain the alley.

Motion by Niemeyer, second by Wischmann to approve consent agenda which included approval of the September 17, 2020 City Council meeting minutes; and approval of pay requests from JEO Consulting Group Inc. general engineering in the amount of \$440.00 and for Sanitary Sewer Replacement – Alleys in the amount of \$26,540.00.
