A regular meeting of the Ashland City Council was held at the Ashland City Hall Council Chambers on the 1st day of June, 2023 at 7:00 p.m.

All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Anderson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and a quorum was declared. Anderson noted the Open Meetings Act located on the south wall of the room.
