A regular meeting of the Ashland City Council was held at the Ashland City Hall Council Chambers on the 19th of April, 2018 at 7:00 p.m.

Notice of meeting was advertised in the Ashland Gazette on April 12, 2018. The Mayor and all Council Members received advance notice of the meeting and a copy of the agenda as shown by the Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Grauerholz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and a quorum was declared. Mayor Grauerholz noted the Open Meetings Act that is posted on the south wall of the Council Chambers.

Mayor Grauerholz opened a Public Hearing on Conditional Use Permit for Exterior Alterations at W 23' 2.5" Lot 8 Block 24 Flora City Addition, located at 1434 Silver Street, Ashland Nebraska at 7:02 p.m. Laura Capp, owner of Post Script, spoke to the Council regarding her application for a permit to replace the awning with a black, scalloped one, to paint a historical sign directly on to the brick, to place one or two perpendicular signs for pedestrians to see, to repaint the door a peach color and to strip and stain the sashing around the door. Zoning Administrator Isom said the Historic Preservation Committee and Planning Commission recommended approval of the application. With no further comments, Mayor Grauerholz closed the Public Hearing at 7:05 p.m.

Mayor Grauerholz opened a Public Hearing on Ordinance 1150 – To Modify the Zoning Map of the City of Ashland Nebraska at 7:06 p.m. Zoning Administrator Isom reviewed the current corridor overlay district that was added in 2016. She said this ordinance would extend the corridor overlay to the other entrances in town, Highway 66 coming in from the north and Ashland Road/Furnas Street coming in from the west. She said this was recommended for approval by the Planning Commission as submitted. With no further comment, Mayor Grauerholz closed the Public Hearing at 7:16 p.m.

He said he would raise the funds for the estimated cost of \$1,100 and he plans to finish the project by the end of summer. Schmidt answered questions of the Council. City Administrator Quady said that Public Works Director Larsen thought the location was good.

She said the biggest changes are the addition of AYBA members as non-voting members to the committee and the school paying 50% of the cost of maintenance on the baseball and softball fields, up from 20%. She said the School Board approved this on Monday night.
