## ASHLAND CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING

February 16, 2017

A regular meeting of the Ashland City Council was held at the Ashland City Hall Council Chambers on the 16th day of February, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.

Notice of meeting was advertised in the Ashland Gazette on February 9, 2017. The Mayor and all Council Members received advance notice of the meeting and a copy of the agenda as shown by the Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Grauerholz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and a quorum was declared. Mayor Grauerholz noted the Open Meetings Act that is posted on the south wall of the Council Chambers.

Mayor Grauerholz opened a public hearing on the One Year and Six Year Road Plan at 7:02 p.m. City Administrator Quady reminded the Council that the plan had been discussed in January with Street Superintendent Troy Johnston. She clarified where the paving is planned for on the east side. Mayor Grauerholz expressed concern about some parcels in the area that currently have liens and if the adjacent roads are paved the City might not get paid for the paving. City Administrator Quady said things like that can be taken into consideration. With no further comment, Mayor Grauerholz closed the Public Hearing at 7:07 p.m.

Mayor Grauerholz opened a public hearing on the Firework License for Hometown Fireworks Inc. at 7:07 p.m. City Administrator Quady said this is the same company that has been licensed in previous years and that there haven't been any issues. With no further comment, Mayor Grauerholz closed the Public Hearing at 7:08 p.m.

City Attorney Fahleson read the Title of Ordinance 1134.

City Administrator Quady said she had confirmed the storm sewer runs in the City right of way along 23rd Street so it is not an issue.

Brian Whitehead of BBW Enterprises LLC spoke to the Council regarding his plans to purchase Ashland Keno Kove and to continue operating keno for the City from there. He said he hopes to close on the purchase on March 1. He said he went to apply for his liquor license at the State today. City Attorney Fahleson said there are some minor modifications that need to be made to the contract as presented to the Council. He recommended that if the Council decides to authorize the Mayor to sign the contract it be conditioned upon the City Administrator and the City Attorney approving the changes on the final draft. City Administrator Quady said this is the same contract that has been approved with Four Sons but that the introductory paragraphs need to be cleaned up and on page 9 the performance bond and line of credit requirements need to be agreed upon. Whitehead said that he is working on the checklist for the Keno Temporary License. He said that as of right now all of the employees will stay the same. Fahleson reviewed the ways the contract may be terminated by the City.
