ASHLAND CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING

January 19, 2017

A regular meeting of the Ashland City Council was held at the Ashland City Hall Council Chambers on the 19th day of January, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.

Notice of meeting was advertised in the Ashland Gazette on January 12, 2017. The Mayor and all Council Members received advance notice of the meeting and a copy of the agenda as shown by the Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Grauerholz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and a quorum was declared. Mayor Grauerholz noted the Open Meetings Act that is posted on the south wall of the Council Chambers.

Mayor Grauerholz opened a public hearing on a request for a lot split at Lots 7-12, Block 43, Miller and Clark Addition, located at 2235 Adams Street at 7:03 p.m. Zoning Administrator Isom stated that the Planning Commission recommended approval of the lot split request. She said that Block 43 has a residence on the northeast quadrant with the remainder of the block used as business property. She said the request is to parcel off the northwest quadrant for another residence. With no further comment, Mayor Grauerholz closed the Public Hearing at 7:06 p.m.

Mayor Grauerholz opened a public hearing for a Zoning Change from B-1 General Commercial to R-2 Medium Density Residential at Lots 7-12, Block 43, Miller and Clark

Addition, located at 2235 Adams Street at 7:06 p.m. Zoning Administrator Isom stated that the Planning Commission recommended approval and stated that it will be nice to have another single family residence in city limits. Monica Payne said that she will love being a part of the Ashland community. With no further comment, Mayor Grauerholz closed the Public Hearing at 7:07 p.m.

Motion by DeVries, seconded by Gossin to introduce and approve first reading of Ordinance 1134 – Zoning Amendment from B-1 General Commercial to R-2 Medium Density Residential.

City Attorney Fahleson read the Title of Ordinance 1134.

City Administrator Quady presented the proposed One and Six Year Road Plan which will officially come before the board in February with a public hearing. She said that nothing has changed from last year with the Silver Street Bridge in the One Year Plan and paving of gravel roads in town in the Six Year Plan. She said that this plan does not include sidewalks.

Motion by Gossin, seconded by Anderson to postpone authorizing the Mayor to sign a transport agreement with Cass County Emergency Management.

City Administrator Quady spoke to the Council regarding the placement of handrails in downtown. She presented a drawing of a proposed handrail along with a bid for two in the amount of \$875. Discussion was held regarding the design and placement of the handrails. She said that the Public Works employees will install the handrails. Karen Stille of Midwest Physical Therapy said that the hand rail could be a straight up post with a loop placed at the edge of the curb for people to pull themselves up onto the curb. The Council requested a new design that would not hang over into the parking area. Quady said she would have a mock up of the handrail available for the Council to see.

City Administrator Quady spoke to the Council regarding the nuisance property at 601 South 8th Street. She said the certified letter that she sent informing the owner, Richene Perkins, regarding the property was returned and that she has sent an additional non-certified letter. Council Member Anderson said that he will talk to and deliver the letter to

Perkins regarding the property. Quady said that she has two bids for demolition. Anderson requested that additional bids for demolition be obtained.

City Administrator Quady stated that this is a formality and that the Council will get the Blight Study back for consideration after the Planning Commission makes its recommendation at their February meeting. She said JEO Consulting Group completed the draft of the study; the last study was done in 2007; and the Whitetail Run plat has changed since then. She said there will be commercial property along Highway 66. Discussion was held regarding access to the highway and the possibility of round-abouts. Discussion continued regarding the development, TIF procedures and annexation.
