A regular meeting of the Ashland City Council was held at the Ashland City Hall Council Chambers on the 18th day of May, 2023 at 7:00 p.m.

Notice of meeting was advertised in the Ashland Gazette on May 11, 2023. The Mayor and all Council Members received advance notice of the meeting and a copy of the agenda as shown by the Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Anderson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and a quorum was declared. Anderson noted the Open Meetings Act located on the south wall of the room.

Mayor Anderson opened a Public Hearing on Application #23-046 for Conditional Use Permit located at 1342 Silver Street at 7:02 p.m. Denise Craft spoke to the Council about the removal of the wooden awning from her building. She said before the old awning came off, they planned to replace the awning; when the awning was removed, they found leaded glass windows that they are removing paint from and straightening. She said her tenant, Blackwells, will be appling to put a sign on the building. She said a picture was found of how the building originally looked and it will look more like that. Zoning Administrator Krejci said the original application was to replace the awning. Krejci said Historic Preservation Committee and the Planning Commission

recommended approval of the removal and replacement of an awning similar to the one on BW's Pub. He stared the replacement of the awning has stopped. He said the work they are doing will be allowed. With no further comments, Mayor Anderson closed the Public Hearing at 7:08 p.m.

Mayor Anderson opened a Public Hearing on Application #23-047 for Conditional Use Permit located at 103 & 111 North 14th Street at 7:09 p.m. Denise Craft, owner of Flutterby Finds, spoke about the new sign they would like to install over the business's doors. Zoning Administrator Krejci said the Historic Preservation Committee and the Planning Commission recommended approval of the sign color and design. He added the sign is in compliance with sign regulations. With no further comments, Mayor Anderson closed the Public Hearing at 7:12 p.m.

Motion by Niemeyer, second by Lofberg to approve second reading of Ordinance 1222 – To extend the Boundaries of the City of Ashland Nebraska.

Assistant City Attorney Meier read the Title of Ordinance 1222.

Assistant City Attorney Meier stated the State Legislature is considering LB580 that may affect property classified agriculture that is annexed. Crnkovich said this will benefit the winery if the bill is passed. Meier explained the bills and their effect on ag land taxation. Discussion followed. Meier said the vote on this ordinance could be

postponed until the next meeting which would be after the Legislature has voted on the bill. Discussion was held regarding the removal of one parcel from the ordinance.

Motion by Crnkovich, second by Lofberg to amend Ordinance 1222 by removing Parcel C from annexation.

Council Member Niemeyer said he would like all the parcels to remain in the ordinance until the next meeting. Council Member Crnkovich said he is in agreement that this parcel will eventually be annexed, when 30th Street is paved and connected to Bluejay Way and the infrastructure loop is completed, but at this time, he would like it removed.

Assistant City Attorney Meier read the Title of Ordinance 1221.

Council Member Crnkovich said currently our rules only allow for a fire pit. He said this ordinance would provide an exemption for 'commercial agricultural operations.' Meier said the term 'ordinarily and customarily performed' was also added. She said this would apply to Cellar 426 and any other land designated as commercial agricultural in the City limits. Mayor Anderson said the fire chief told the City Administrator that he didn't have a problem with this ordinance. Discussion was held regarding what direct supervision by the fire department means.
