November 2, 2017

A regular meeting of the Ashland City Council was held at the Ashland City Hall Council Chambers on the 2nd day of November, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.

Notice of meeting was advertised in the Ashland Gazette on October 26, 2017. The Mayor and all Council Members received advance notice of the meeting and a copy of the agenda as shown by the Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Grauerholz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and a quorum was declared. Mayor Grauerholz noted the Open Meetings Act that is posted on the south wall of the Council Chambers.

Motion by DeVries, second by Anderson to approve Resolution 2017-10 – Request to Close Highway 66 and Silver Street intersection for Chamber of Commerce Parade.

City Administrator Quady said the Chamber's Hometown Christmas Parade of Lights committee has asked if they can cross 14th Street, a state highway, so the parade can end at the Community Resource Center where the tree and Santa will be. She said this resolution is a requirement of the State and says the City will accept responsibility if something happens. She said the Chamber President said the intersection would be used approximately 15 minutes, but the resolution reads 5:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Council Member Gossin expressed a concern about 'driving' all the traffic onto 13th Street including the dispersing of the parade and the highway traffic from both the

north and south. Quady said there will a police officer, if not on a call, and Chamber volunteers assisting with traffic at the intersection. She said the State requires a 30-day notice. Discussion was held.

Motion by Mollhoff, second by Anderson to amend motion to approve Resolution pending an action plan from the Chamber with approval of the chief of police, rescue and fire.

Council Member DeVries accepted the amendment to the motion.
