## ASHLAND CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING

October 15, 2020

A regular meeting of the Ashland City Council was held at the Ashland Community Resource Center on the 15th day of October, 2020 at 7:00 p.m.

Notice of meeting was advertised in the Ashland Gazette on October 8, 2020. The Mayor and all Council Members received advance notice of the meeting and a copy of the agenda as shown by the Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Grauerholz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and a quorum was declared. Mayor Grauerholz noted the Open Meetings Act located on the south end of the room.

Michael Meyer, Fire Chief, spoke to the Council regarding the need for new radios for the fire department to improve communications. He said the current radio system is outdated and no longer supported. He said members have communication issues when out on calls and at fires. He said he is asking for 20 new radios to go into the rigs. He said county wide they are changing to a new radio system using Motorola radios and they are currently available at a sale price. He added the Rural Fire Board has agreed to funding the purchase and he is wondering what the City's contribution would be.

Mayor Grauerholz opened a Public Hearing on Conditional Use Permit #20-115 for Domestic Dog Kennel at W1/2 of Tract 2-part NW, NW Section 2-12-9, located at 2701

Furnas Street, Ashland NE at 7:07 p.m. Zoning Administrator Krejci stated the Planning Commission recommended approval of the permit. With no further comment, Mayor Grauerholz closed the Public Hearing at 7:08 p.m.

Mayor Grauerholz opened a Public Hearing on Public Ways Vacation Application Ordinance 1186 for vacating all of 5<sup>th</sup> Street (293') between Dale & Elm Street, vacating all (252') of alley way thru Block 7 Beetison's Addition, vacate all of the East (126') of alley way Block 8 Beetison's Addition, Ashland NE at 7:08 p.m. Zoning Administrator Krejci said there has been a request to abandon the streets and alleys in that location and no sewer or water is shown in this area. He said the area has ditches and is wooded and is backed by the golf course. He said one block will be combined for a single house with private access to it. He added 5<sup>th</sup> Street has been vacated to the south already. He said the water line will be tapped off of 6<sup>th</sup> Street and it will be hooked up to a septic system. With no further comment, Mayor Grauerholz closed the Public Hearing at 7:16 p.m.

Mayor Grauerholz reported on nuisance property on North 26<sup>th</sup> Street saying there is equipment on the property as they are getting ready for the demolition and clean up. City Administrator Quady said the gas line will be abandoned on Friday and the water and sewer lines will be abandoned on Monday or Tuesday. Grauerholz said that Windstream did receive a grant for broadband in Ashland. He said there has been a request for reserved

customer parking in the downtown area. He said the Chamber President will discuss downtown parking with Chamber members and come back with input.

City Administrator Quady provided a handout with information on the Motorola radios and the radio funding will be on the next agenda. She said on the fire budget wish list were the radios in the amount of \$160,000. She said during the budget planning, the Council talked about evaluating the fire, rescue and police communications next budget year and potentially doing the public service tax. She said Matt Meyer has applied for grants but the department has never gotten one for this. She stated the list price for a radio is about \$11,000 but they are on sale now for \$7,600 apiece; and 20 of them will be about \$170,000. She said the Rural Fire Board will purchase the radios and they want the City's agreement to pay for half. She said a payment option could be for the Rural Fire to forgo their contribution to the City two years or the City could implement the public safety tax. She added it will be on the next agenda.

Council Member Anderson asked for an update on the Nebraska Department of Transportation response to repairing sidewalks along 14<sup>th</sup> Street.
